General Safety Form

Blacksmithing is a dangerous activity. Persons participating in blacksmith classes, workshops or other, or are present in a blacksmith shop or on the premises where blacksmithing is taking place in the course of events, face many dangers. Among the dangers are handling metal at extremely high temperatures (sometimes in excess of 2000 degrees F), working around and using hammers, tools anvils, power hammers, grinders, welders, metal saws and sharp pieces of metal, etc. There are often fumes from the fire present. These are examples only and is not intended to list all dangers that a person may face awhile on the premises where metal work is being conducted. In order for Brunetta Blacksmithing to present programs involving blacksmithing, it must be able to do so functionally. The dangers associated with blacksmithing are something for which the undersigned participant is at risk of as a condition of participation in the activities, or being on the premises where such activities are in place.
